Quilt Reflections 2025 MEMBERS QUILT CHALLENGE

Children's Rehabilitation Foundation

For each Quilt Reflections show, members of Manitoba Prairie Quilters are challenged to create a wall quilt from a pre-selected assortment of fabrics. The quilts are hung at the show and members of the public are invited to bid on them, with net proceeds donated to a local charity. The chosen charity for 2025 is the Children's Rehabilitation Foundation, specifically their bike program. These bikes provide mobility, independence and inclusion to many youths living with disabilities in our province. The bikes are very expensive, ranging in price from \$2000 to \$6500. The demand continues to increase each year, and the waitlist of requests grows daily.

The kit consists of three fabrics, with up to 5 additional fabrics being allowed. The suggested theme is *Transportation*. A ribbon and honorarium will be awarded in each of the three categories of Workmanship, Creativity/Use of Fabric, and Innovation/Design.

Quilts will be sold by silent auction, with bids closing at **3:00 pm, Saturday, April 12, 2025**. All entries have a reserve bid of \$40. The entire net proceeds from this auction will go to the Children's Rehabilitation Foundation for their bike program.

Thank you to all who are planning to participate in this challenge. The finished hangings are due **April 1, 2025**. They may be turned in at the MPQ in-person meeting in March or contact either of the co-chairs to make arrangements: Val Hazelton (<u>valeriehazelton@mymts.net</u>) or Yvonne Naismith (<u>naismith@mymts.net</u>). Photos of the entries are posted on the Quilt Reflections webpage as they are received. We look forward to seeing and promoting your wonderful works of art.

The Children's Foundation is a Manitoba charity dedicated to helping children and youth live as independently as possible. It is the fundraising entity for the Rehabilitation Centre for Children, an outpatient facility providing services and outreach therapy in support of children and youth to enable them to participate fully in their communities. Quilt Reflections Boutique

All members are invited to participate in the Quilt Reflections Boutique at this year's quilt show. This is your opportunity to showcase your projects and get paid for them! The boutique will be located in the corner to the right of the entrance in the Merchant Mall and will be supported with additional signage and creative merchandising.



We welcome new quilt-related items, large and small, to be displayed and sold to the general public. Members keep 85% of the selling price with the remaining 15% going to the Quilt Show General Fund.

Suggested items are small quilts, wall hangings, tote bags, wallets and pillowcases etc. These have been popular in previous years; however, we encourage you to use your imagination.

Registration forms to list your items are available by contacting co-chairs or by completing the form on the MPQ website. We ask that prices be rounded to the nearest dollar, so we are not dealing with change. Price tags will need to show your membership number, item number and price as listed on your registration sheet.

All merchandise for the boutique must be brought to the Victoria Inn and Convention Center (Regency Room) on **Monday April 7** between the hours of **1:00 pm and 7:00 pm** to be inventoried and registered with the boutique committee. Bring the completed registration form with your merchandise. Please bring them in a container that is labeled with your name and phone number. All unsold items must be picked up at the close of the show on **Saturday April 12** between **5:00p.m.** and **6:00 pm**.




Quilt Show & Competition Entries - Judges' Biographies

Debora Barlow

Exploring and implementing the elements and principles of design to showcase work in different mediums has been Debora's life's work. As a master florist, long arm quilter and fiber artist, she seeks the highest levels of design and quality workmanship.

Representing Canada in the Interflora World Cup in Amsterdam, Netherlands, was the highlight of her floral industry career.



In 2004 she began long arm quilting. Debora's Quilting and Design became an extension of her pursuit of design excellence in quilting. As well as quilting award winning pieces for others she creates innovative art quilts utilizing a range of techniques.

Her work has been viewed at the International Quilt Show in Houston, the CQA/ACC National Juried Show, the juried Grand National, the touring exhibition "Dimensions" with the Saskatchewan Craft Council and been recognized in many other group exhibits.

Debora is a CQA/ACC National Certified Judge and holds juried status as a professional crafts person and fiber artist with the Saskatchewan Craft Council.

She is an active member and past president of the Saskatoon Quilters Guild.

Carole Gold

CQA/ACC Certified Quilt Judge

Carole is an experienced needleworker, longarm quilter and artist. Her work has been juried into both art and quilt shows, winning awards along the way. A thirst for learning and a love of quilts led Carole to pursue certification as a quilt judge. As a judge, she supports others wishing to further develop their quilting and design skills.

Carole's deep respect for quilters is shown through her kind, thoughtful, specific and constructive judging comments. In addition to judging throughout Canada, Carole has worked behind the scenes of the Canadian National Juried Show as a juror, jury coordinator, judging coordinator, Quilt Judge Certification Program instructor, and national show judge.

<u>**Judged Competition Categories**</u>

Each entrant is responsible for ensuring that the quilt is in the correct judging category. Entries will not be re-categorized.

- A. One Person, Small Quilt Stationary Machine Quilting*
 - Perimeter of 200" or less
- B. One Person, Medium Quilt Stationary Machine Quilting*
 - Perimeter greater than 200" but less than 320"
- C. One Person, Large Quilt Stationary Machine Quilting*
 - Perimeter of 320" or greater
- **D. One Person, Small Quilt** Longarm Quilting**
 - Perimeter of 200" or less
- E. One Person, Medium Quilt Longarm Quilting**
 - Perimeter greater than 200" but less than 320"
- F. One Person, Large Quilt -Longarm Quilting**
 - Perimeter of 320" or greater
- G. Two Person, Small Quilt
 - Perimeter of 200" or less
 - Any quilting method
- H. Two Person, Medium Quilt
 - Perimeter greater than 200" but less than 320"
 - Any quilting method
- I. Two Person, Large Quilt
 - Perimeter of 320" or greater
 - Any quilting method
- J. Group Quilt
 - Made by three or more people with any division of labour.

K. Art Quilt

- Entrant's own original design.
- Quilt may not be made or directly adapted from a commercially available pattern.
- Quilt may be pictorial or graphic, and its primary function should be as art to be displayed.

L. Quilted Home Decor

- Quilt's primary function is decorative, includes wall hangings, table runners, tree skirts, bed runners etc.
- Quilt must be made or directly adapted from a commercially available pattern not original design.

M. Wearable Art

- Items should be three dimensional in nature such as garments, bags, shoes etc.
- Items **must** have front, batting and backing layers and be quilted.
- Quilting stitches may or may not be visible on back/inside if a lining is used.

N. First Entry in Competition

• Quilter has never entered a quilt in any judged competition.

O. Applique, Small Quilt

- Primary focus of category is the applique all methods of applique.
- Perimeter of 240" or less.
- Quilted in any manner.

P. Applique, Large Quilt

- Primary focus of category is the applique all methods of applique.
- Perimeter greater than 240".
- Quilted in any manner.

Q. Handwork

- Primary focus of category is Handwork (Hand piecing, hand quilting, embroidery etc.).
- Hand work can be combined with machine piecing/quilting.

R. Youth

• Made by quilters aged 17 and under.



NOTES:

*Stationary Machine Quilting

Quilting by machine where the machine remains in a fixed position and the fabric moves when forming the stitches. Includes domestic, sit down long and mid arms and embroidery machines.

**Longarm Quilting

Quilting by machine where the fabric is held stationary on a frame and the quilter moves the machine by hand or computer. Includes longarms, midarms and domestic machines on frames.

- Categories G, H and I will have one monetary prize for the entrant with two ribbons.
- **Category J** will have one monetary prize and one ribbon.
- **Be sure to accurately measure your quilt** quilts in incorrect categories will be disqualified with no critique **fees will not be refunded**.
- All entries must be one single unit, framed or mounted entries cannot be accepted
 due to hanging limitations.
- **Members may enter one quilt per category**, with a total of five (5) quilts as space allows.
- If QR is unable to show and/or judge all quilts, quilter will be consulted.
- Any quilt not hung or judged will have fees refunded/adjusted
- Quilt Registration Fees
 - o Judged \$15.00
 - o Non-Judged \$10.00
 - o Youth \$5.00





Judged Quilt Awards

First, second and third place ribbons may be awarded in each category. Depending on entries, prizes may not be awarded in all categories.

The monetary awards are as follows:

1st place \$ 125.00

2nd place \$ 100.00

3rd place \$ 75.00

Sponsored Excellence Awards

Everyone who enters a quilt in the show OR judged competition is eligible for Excellence Awards.

The awards will be chosen by a judge, vendor or sponsor through special arrangement with the committee. These awards include Certificate of Excellence, rosette ribbon, and \$100.00 to be presented at the banquet.

Arlene Crabbe Memorial Youth Category

To encourage our young quilters and recognize their skills, the Youth Category established in 2016 will be featured again this year.

The parameters are as follows:

- 1 Non-competitive, for show only, youth 17 and under.
- 2. All entries will receive a participation ribbon, written comments and a fat quarter to encourage further creative endeavours!
- 3. The quilts will not be judged, however, a qualified judge will offer a few encouraging written words about the quilt for each entrant.
- 4. Limit of one entry per youth entrant.
- 5. Entrant must be sponsored by a MPQ member in good standing known to the youth. The entry would **not** count as one of the maximum of five entries allowed for that member.
- 6. The Youth entries will have their own space set aside for hanging so they can be displayed together.
- 7. Each entry will be eligible for one of four draws of \$25 sponsored by a special sponsor. The draw will take place at **1:00 p.m.** on **Saturday, April 12, 2025** at the youth display.

2025 Competition Quilt Entry Form Information

Entry Deadline: March 15th, 2025

All entrants must complete the entry information.

Entry forms are available on the MPQ website, www.manitobaprairiequilters.ca.

Use one form per entry.

Please verify that all information entered is correct before you click on the Submit button. The information cannot be changed after the button has been clicked.

The **Quilt Label** and **Claim Form** will be emailed after members register the quilt. See Quilt Label and Claim Form, Page 11.

Other Requirements

- All competition/show entries must be made by current <u>2024/2025</u> members of the Manitoba Prairie Quilters
- MPQ members <u>must</u> have paid their 2024/2025 membership dues as of <u>January 1</u>, <u>2025</u> (full membership fee \$30.00).
- Fees for each quilt entry are non-refundable.
- Quilt entries submitted without appropriate fees will not be considered for the show. All entries and fees must be received no later than March 15, 2025. Entry forms and entry fees must be completed on the Manitoba Prairie Quilters website. (www.manitobaprairiequilters.ca)

Ouilt Show Label and Claim Form

For each quilt entry submitted, a **label and claim form** will be emailed to the member.

Before dropping off your quilt/item, at Victoria Inn Hotel and Convention Centre, the **Label** must be securely attached to the back of the quilt/item on the bottom left corner. The **Claim Form** is for after the show. The **Claim Form** is retained by the member. It must be shown to claim your quilt/item after the show.

Quilt Drop Off and Pick up

All quilts/items (show and competition) must be delivered to Victoria Inn Hotel and Conference Centre. Regency Room (enter hotel from front entrance on Wellington) 1808 Wellington Ave., on **Monday, April 7, 2025** between **1:00 pm and 7:00 pm.** Quilts/items will NOT be accepted after 7:00 pm.

Quilts/items will be returned to entrants at Victoria Inn Hotel and Convention Centre, Ballroom on **Saturday**, **April 12th**, **2025** from **5:30 to 6:30 p.m.** No quilts/items can be released before that time. Entrants must have the claim forms and will have to sign for their quilts/items.

Entrants who have quilts/items in the competition may pick up their Judging Score card and prize money (if they have won an award) at the same time as they pick up their quilts/items.
